

## **Careers Guidance Provider Access Policy Statement**

### Introduction

This policy statement sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to students at the school for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

## Student entitlement

All students in years 7-11 are provided with the opportunity to

- find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point;
- hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships through options and careers events, assemblies, group discussions and taster events;
- understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses, employment with training and apprenticeships.

For students of compulsory school age these encounters are mandatory and there will be a minimum of two encounters for students during the 'first key phase' (year 8 to 9) and two encounters for students during the 'second key phase' (year 10 to 11).

These provider encounters will be scheduled during the main school hours and the provider will be given a reasonable amount of time to, as a minimum:

- share information about both the provider and the approved technical education qualification and apprenticeships that the provider offers
- explain what career routes those options could lead to
- provide insights into what it might be like to learn or train with that provider (including the opportunity to meet staff and students from the provider)
- answer questions from students.

# Meaningful provider encounters

One encounter is defined as one meeting/session between students and one provider. We are committed to providing meaningful encounters to all students using the Making it meaningful checklist.

Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) is supported by independent and impartial Careers Advisers Ms Theresa Petzold and Ms Geeta Uppal. Ms Petzold is available to meet with students in the Employability and Enterprise Hub every Wednesday and Friday and fortnightly on a Tuesday and Ms Uppal every Tuesday. Appointments are scheduled for all KS4 students and can also be booked by students in Y7-11 through their Head of Year, the Careers Leader or Careers Adviser.

We work closely with The Careers and Enterprise Company, Solent Local Enterprise Partnership, EBP South, Southern Universities Network, University of Southampton, Solent University, the University of Reading, local further education institutions and training providers and have an Enterprise Adviser to support with CEIAG provision.
